Memorandum of Understanding Signed Between AKSK and the British Council to Strengthen Cybersecurity Capacity Development



The National Cyber Security Authority and the British Council have signed a Memorandum of Understanding, establishing a long-term framework for cooperation in skills development, policy support, and capacity building in cybersecurity.

The Memorandum aims to deepen collaboration through training programs, talent and capacity development initiatives in the field of cybersecurity, with a particular focus on creating concrete opportunities for girls and women seeking to develop professionally in this sector.

Launch of the Cybersecurity Talent Club: A new space for talent development

During the month of February, the Cybersecurity Talent Club was launched, an initiative of the National Cyber Security Authority aimed at creating a space for young people interested in cybersecurity. The initial meetings focused on building a culture of digital security, addressing topics such as cyber hygiene, credential management, and the risks associated with unsafe behaviors in professional environments. Through discussions and the analysis of concrete scenarios, participants were introduced to real-world challenges and practical approaches to addressing them.

The sessions also served as a platform for collaboration and the exchange of ideas among students, professionals, and business representatives, laying the foundations for a new network of cooperation in this field.
