AKSK held public hearings on changes to the draft law on cybersecurity

The National Cyber Security Authority held public hearings on the proposed amendments to Law No. 25/2024 "On Cybersecurity", with the participation of representatives of state institutions, operators of critical and important information infrastructures, as well as the banking sector.

During the meetings, the innovations provided for in the draft law were presented, while the participants shared their comments and suggestions. The amendments aim to strengthen cyber protection mechanisms, increase capacities for preventing and responding to incidents, clarify the obligations of operators and increase the sustainability of the cyber ecosystem in the country.



Albania in the UN Global Mechanism for ICT and International Security

Albania participated in the plenary sessions of the Global Mechanism for Information and Communication Technologies, held at the United Nations headquarters in New York.

During the discussions, Albania's assessment of the growing cyber threats, including attacks on public institutions and critical infrastructures, disinformation and the risks from the misuse of Artificial Intelligence, was presented. Albania reaffirmed its commitment to strengthening international cooperation and responsible behavior of states in cyberspace.

AKSK announces the national team that will represent Albania at ECSC 2026

The National Cyber Security Authority has concluded the selection process of the national team that will represent Albania in the European Cyber Security Challenge (ECSC) 2026. After the completion of the qualifying stages, the 10 finalists of Team Albania were selected, based on the results, the coaches' assessment and their technical skills.

The Albanian team will compete from October 12 to 16, 2026 in Bochum, Germany, against national teams from Europe, in challenges that include cryptography, web application security, reverse engineering and forensics.
